COVID-19 PROTOCOLS & GUIDELINES

Welcome to the 2021 Ocala Spring Premier Horse Shows. Our Ocala Spring Staff takes Covid-19 very seriously and ask that all our participants do so as well. We will be following USEF/ WHO/CDC guidelines that have been established for horse shows until further notice.

- Wear a mask at all times on the showgrounds except when mounted on a horse, if you need a mask, we will have them in the office and at the ingate areas.
- There will be designated safety associates that will remind participants to wear a mask if they are seen without a mask on the showgrounds.
- Wash your hands frequently.
- Maintain social distancing and stay 6 feet apart.
- If you are feeling ill, please do not come onto the show grounds.
- If you have any questions about COVID-19, please see our paramedic.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at each in gate and the office.
- Please do not stay on the showgrounds to watch others compete.
- Please leave the show after you compete and go enjoy the beautiful town of Ocala.
- USEF has given the authority to the stewards and show management to ask someone to leave if they are not following the outlined procedures.
- If you leave the show and become ill within two weeks, please advise the Classic Company.

Everyone coming to participate in any manner in the Ocala Spring Premier Horse Shows needs to complete a waiver for USEF in order to come on the show grounds. The USEF waiver will be filled out when you complete your online entry, all others must sign the waivers upon arrival at the security gate.

At the security gate, after it is confirmed you completed your waiver, you will receive a wrist band that you are required to wear at all times while being on the showgrounds.

The USEF rules allow owners, lessees, riders, athletes, parents, trainers, coaches, and any other support personnel/staff that are essential to providing care to the horses or athletes to attend the competition. As a clarification, the USEF rules *do* allow parents, not just a single parent.

The USEF prohibits spectators at our competition at this point but will update this policy if or when it changes.

TEMPERATURE & HEALTH CHECKS.

- We will be doing temperature checks at the entrance to the facility and if your temperature is below 100.4, you will gain access to the show grounds. Also, there will be random temperature checks throughout the grounds each day.
- You may not enter the facility if you can answer yes to any of the following questions:
 - Have you or anyone that you have had close contact with exhibited COVID-19 symptoms in the past 14 days.
 - *Symptoms of COVID-19 include: Fever, Dry cough, Tiredness, Aches and pains, Sore throat, Diarrhea, Conjunctivitis, Headache, Loss of taste or smell, a rash on skin, discoloration of fingers or toes, Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, Chest pain or pressure, Loss of speech, Loss of movement.*
 - Have you or anyone that you have had close contact with tested positive for COVID-19 within last 14 days.
- We will have team members dedicated to monitoring COVID-19 Protocol compliance.

HORSE SHOW OFFICE WORK

- All Entries must be done online at [horseshowsonline.com](https://www.horseshowsonline.com)
- Everyone must sign the online USEF Covid waiver before you are allowed onto competition grounds.
- All adds and scratches are to be done online at [Mobile.horseshowsonline.com](https://www.Mobile.horseshowsonline.com)
- All feed and bedding orders are to be done online or by emailing office@horseshowservices.com
- All check ins must have a designated person from your barn to pick up numbers.
- You may check out online or a designated person from your barn may check you out.
- Horse Show bills, upon request, will be sent to the trainer for review Saturday night and then can request e-bills for payment.

In-Gate

- Each starter will have an area for protection from the elements. it is their space, please respect them by maintaining proper social distancing.
- Pay attention to the barn calls so that you arrive at the right time for your classes, not too early and not too late.

BARN AREA & TRAINER RESPONSIBILITY

- Each Trainer is responsible for their entire group including riders, grooms, support personnel, etc. We ask that you please make sure your entire group is aware of requirements and prepared to comply with all facility protocols.
- Each Trainer is responsible for setting the policies of social distancing in their own Barn & Stable area.
- Each Trainer will be responsible for distributing and enforcing the use of masks or PPE to all employees and clients.
- Each Trainer should have a support plan in place for any member of their team that is denied access to the event due to medical concerns.
- Do not mix equipment (tack, grooming supplies, lead shanks, etc.) and sanitize between each use.

- We strongly suggest that those individuals grooming are the only people in the barn area and that horses will be brought out to the rider if that person is not the one grooming.
- Braiding will be permitted but it is each trainers responsibility to set the policies for the Braiders in your Barn & Stable Area.
- We strongly suggest that the trainers set a schedule to regularly sanitize golf carts, bikes, cars/trucks and stable doors, buckets, light switches, equipment in your barn area including tack, grooming, feeding, stall cleaning materials, surfaces in common areas, etc.
